



PORTFOLIO MANAGER COMMENT

The sudden war in the Middle East led to major movements in global markets during the month. The market-weighted world index measured in USD was down almost -9% but recovered on the last trading day and ended at just over -7%. The fund ended the month down -3.1% (class C), the fund's benchmark index down -1.4% and the global market-weighted index down -2.0%. The fund had a very strong performance during the previous month relative to the global market-weighted index, which reversed somewhat during this month. This means that the fund's performance is still in line with expectations over several months.

There has been an overall weak performance among the fund's sector exposures. The best sector in terms of average performance in local currency was utilities, followed by technology. The monthly return was clearly weighed down by negative contributions from above all industrials and consumer staples, which was a combination of weak performance and high weight. Grouped by country, Norway was the only market with positive performance of +1%, while the USA performed the weakest with a decline of -8%. The US also made the biggest negative contribution to the fund. In the currency market, all currencies strengthened against SEK, with the biggest movements being USD (+4.8%) and HKD (+4.6%) followed by GBP (+3.2%).

The following companies had the biggest movements during the month: Yara International (+17%), Unilever (-23%) and INWIT (-24%). The fund currently has an equity exposure of 100%.

INVESTMENT GOAL AND STRATEGY

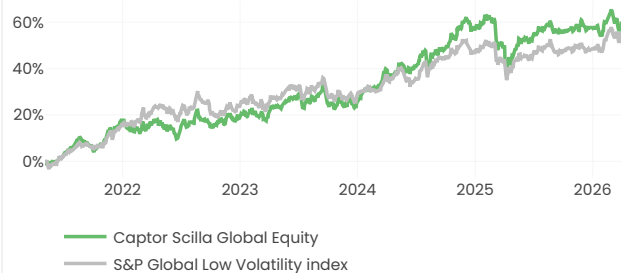
Captor Scilla Global Equity is an actively managed fund that invests globally in developed market equities. The fund is based on Captor's investment strategy Scilla. The strategy invests in companies that offer an attractive ratio between expected return and risk, compared to the global market as a whole. The fund excludes from its universe companies that does not comply with Captor's ESG screening criteria, and screens its positions continuously.

Furthermore the strategy can shift the total equity exposure of the fund. In volatile markets the fund can hold up to 50% in cash or high grade bonds, and apply up to 20% leverage in calmer markets. The selection method means that the strategy is exposed to 200-300 companies, which is approximately one fifth of the fund's investable universe. The fund's strategy is tuned only slightly over time while the fundamental strategy stays the same.

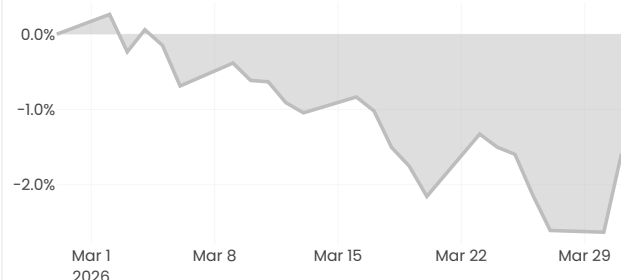

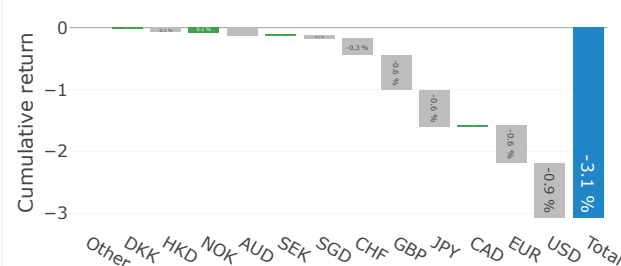
PERFORMANCE



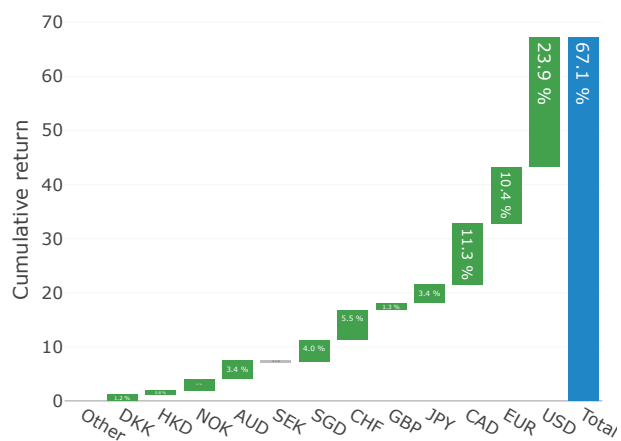
RELATIVE PERFORMANCE



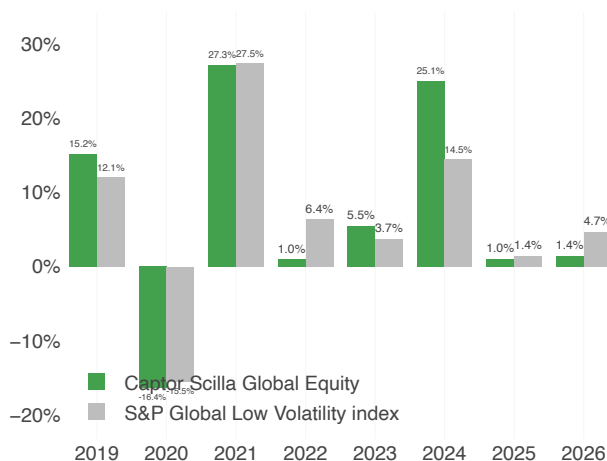
ATTRIBUTION THIS MONTH



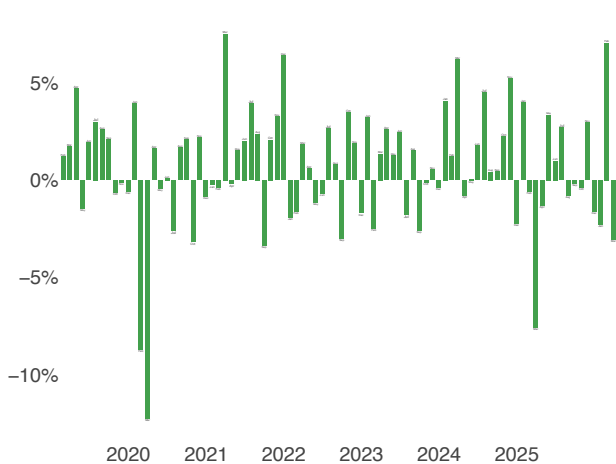
CUMULATIVE ATTRIBUTION



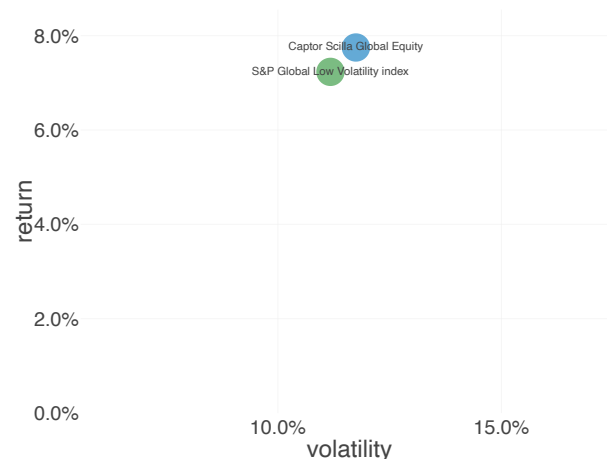
YEARLY RETURNS



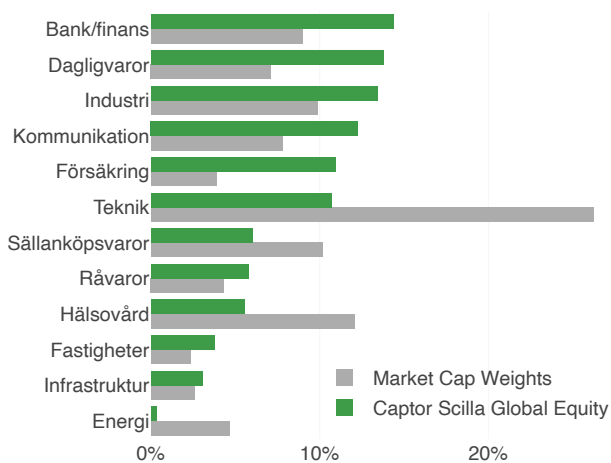
MONTHLY RETURNS



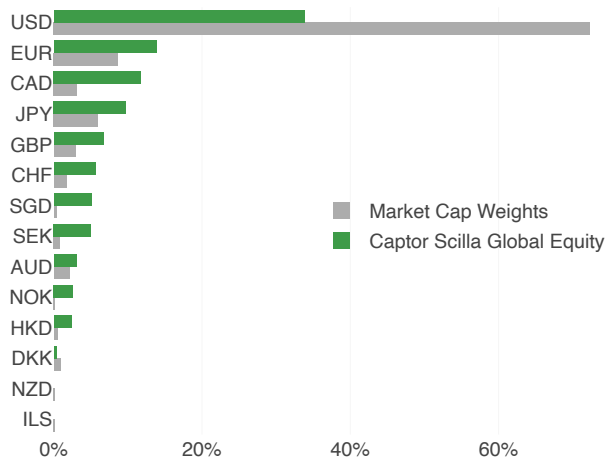
RETURN VS VOLATILITY

REASONS TO INVEST

Captor Scilla Global Equity is suitable for those who want an allocation to global equities and at the same time have a stable level of risk.

HOW TO INVEST IN THE FUND

Some of the fund's share classes are available through Swedish banks and fund platforms. Furthermore, some share classes have a higher minimum investment, and for such share classes a dilution levy can be applied at subscription/redemption in order to protect the fund's shareholders. The process is the same as employed by exchange traded funds and also allows for physical creations/redemptions.

RISK PROFILE

The fund aims to have lower volatility than the corresponding market value-weighted investment over time, primarily reducing large sequential drawdowns in times of stressed markets.
